This update comes in response to the recent Federal Court decision of Yves Chouéfaty v. Attorney General of Canada, 2020 FC 837 where the Court set out a long-overdue criticism of the previous Examination Guidelines of the CIPO on subject-matter eligibility.

Pursuant to the PCT, the Canadian Patent Office may receive an International Patent Application as a "Receiving Office" if the applicant is a national or resident of Canada (or if there is more than one applicant, at least one of the applicants is a national or resident of Canada).
